16 How do you know what to call someone? Do you use their first name or last

39 call someone can be very confusing!

53 In a social setting, people usually use their first names. If you were introduced
71 to Tom Hunt at a party, you would call him Tom. If you met Mary Redwood at a
77 park, you would call her Mary.

90 Business settings tend to be different. When you first meet an employer, you
105 should address him or her by their last name. However, some employers like to be
120 called by their first names. Use the employer's last name unless he or she says,
126 "Call me by my first name."

140 Women may use the title of *Miss*, *Mrs.*, or *Ms.* What's the difference between
156 them? *Ms.* is used for all women, whether they are married or not. *Miss* shows that
167 a woman is unmarried. *Mrs.* shows that a woman is married.

180 Knowing what to call someone can be very confusing. When you're not sure,
189 ask the person what they **prefer** to be called.
